
#### UNDERSTAND

#### CREATE

- 3. Decide which idea is the strongest based on the visual ideas you've come up with.

- 5. **Draw** your cartoon in your own style, using simple line work for shading. You may add colour if you'd like, or shade it in varying tones of black and white.







- Connect the dots below with three straight lines: one very light, one mid-tone, and one very dark.


